# Central Iowa Model A Club Newsletter Mike Youngblood

This is something that might happen to you someday....

I recently drove my new 1930 Town Sedan (new to me) over to **Al Fredregill's** house to have him check the toe-in. When I got there I noticed an unusual amount of oil dripping from the back of the engine. I looked at it and said, "Oh crap, what is this mess?" **Al** said in his usual calm voice as he proceeded with the steering adjustment, "Rear Main is Leaking." Well I had heard horror stories about the time and energy needed to shim the bearings so you can imagine the look on my face.

**Al** got the steering adjusted and checked the toe-in so I headed home. When I got home I looked behind the car on the drive way only to see little drops of oil following along behind. I ordered all of the parts for the job.

I was on line looking up information about the process and one of the articles I read said, that any issues causing pressure to build up in the crank case could cause oil to be pushed out the rear main. I thought it would be worth a shot at checking some things before starting. I opened the oil filler tube and noticed a lot of build up around the baffles of the filler tube. This was caused by moisture in the tube over time. I pulled the filler tube out of the car and cleaned it all out. I put the filler tube back in the car, started the engine and let it run for awhile. Much to my surprise the excessive oil drip stopped. I drove the car for about 5 miles and stopped to check it again and it was not leaking!

As **Al** always says, "check the simple stuff first". He is sooooo wise! Probably the second smartest person I know...

#### We chose to reprint this article from the Iowa Newsletter for a couple of reasons.

1. **Al Fredregill**, the "second smartest person" is a long time member of the Central Iowa Club. He and his family have attended most all of the regional meets that we have held in Wichita. He has worked on Model A's for many years and has a lot of practical knowledge of repairs to them. We remember that he had a large tennis shoe, maybe size 15, dangling from a rear bumper bracket and **Al** was frequently referred to as "Big Foot".

Always enjoyed visiting with **Al**.

### Tech Talk continued from previous page:

2. Crank Case pressure: The 2<sup>nd</sup> year in existence of this club, 1966, a large contingent of members (16 cars) drove to the National Model A Ford meet in Albuquerque. This was approximately a 1600

mile round trip. One very experienced driver (now deceased) had to add 32 quarts of oil to his car during this trip and it was a recent rebuild. He chose to insert a "chore boy" also referred to as a, pot scrubber, in his oil filler pipe. His theory was that this would stop blow by under the hood. I don't know if he ever discovered that this was the source of pressure that was blowing oil out of the rear main.

There is an accessory available that attaches to the filler pipe and directs this pressure under the car via a flexible tube and leaves the passenger side of the engine much cleaner. I don't like this accessory as it is in the way of checking the dipstick and other tasks, and it has some sharp edges.

Somewhere, someone told me to put a sock over the filler pipe and cap which would allow the crankcase to adequately breathe and it could periodically be changed when it filled up with residue. A white sock works best so you can tell when it is soiled and needs to be replaced. My wife saves old white socks so I have an adequate source.

The "sock system" has worked well for me and I have had no problems with a leaky rear main. **Roger Graham**
