

Speedy delivery

When Grover Smith dawdled, his son took matters into his own hands - and foot.

The income from G.V. Smith Dairy of Lone Pine, California-named for my father, Grover-was a good part of our livelihood. But since Dad also worked full time for the Los Angeles department of water and power, Mom, my brother Don and yours truly helped by delivering milk all over town in our Model A pickup.

One Sunday, Mom burst out of the house shouting about the attack on Pearl Harbor. Soon enough, Don went off to serve, and I became Dad's main man at the dairy. Instead of delivering milk to many customers, we began selling it in bulk to Willis Dairy, south of town. And every day, I faced something that truly irritated me.

You see, Grover Smith was not a fast driver.

A 10-mile round trip doesn't sound so bad unless you're the one riding along, exhausted from a long, hard day, with no other thought except crawling into a comfortable bed. Ole Grover just puttered along at a painfully slow pace, one arm draped lazily over the wheel, eyelids low, calmly taking in the scenery over the dashboard.

He drove me nuts.

Around this time, I saw a movie, *The Chase*, in which a gangster rigged his gas pedal so he could operate it from the backseat. He would take over the car,

tearing around the streets, to the horror of the driver. That gave me an idea.

I took a piece of baling wire and made a loop at one end for my foot. Then I threaded it strategically around the choke and linkage so that, when I pulled up on the wire, the accelerator went down. I was in business

That night, I waited until we got halfway out of town. Then I slowly lifted my looped foot-and sure enough, we began moving faster. I snuck a look at Dad, but he continued staring out into the night. Encouraged, I held my breath and pulled harder. The gas pedal hit the floor, and Dad jolted to attention. He grabbed the hand gas lever, but nothing happened. Then he hit the spark advance, and the backfire was breathtaking.

Zoom! We bounced past the entrance to Willis Dairy, Dad hollering while I turned purple, stifling a good hard laugh. Slowly I let off my accelerator wire, and we coasted to a stop.

I didn't touch that wire the whole ride home, but my invention had a surprising result. Our little joyride made Dad wary every time he climbed behind the wheel. He never quite got up to a speed I would have liked, but we no longer dawdled along at a pedestrian's pace.



COMPOUND PROBLEM???




