
NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT





AUTOMATIC GEAR SHIFT FOR THE MODEL A

The Cartwright Automatic Gear Shift Corp. of Indianapolis, In., introduced a kit in 1931 to change the Model A to what they called "Automatic Shift." The shift lever was totally eliminated and the shifting action was to be done with the clutch pedal. There was a small lever under the steering wheel to shift to neutral or reverse. We have never seen of heard of any of these in existence so we have to wonder how successful or troublesome they might have been?

As far as history books go GM was first with the automatic transmission which was offered on the 1940 Oldsmobile. RG



A new and amazing invention for Ford cars has been perfected by the Cartwright Automatic Gear Shift Corporation, 1450 East 19th Street, Indianapolis, Indiana.

This mechanical gear shift does away entirely with the lever assembly in the Ford, and operates from the clutch pedal in the same way as the clutch is now used before shifting gears with the gear lever. Over 90 per cent of the gear shifting is done by the clutch pedal alone. A convenient lever being placed immediately below the steering wheel for the tips of the fingers to operate when shifting into neutral or reverse.

Safety, one of the greatest words in automobile driving, it is claimed, is greatly increased by the Cartwright Automatic Gear Shift. The gear shift is operated entirely by mechanical action. There are no electric magnetic currents to get out of order. It is self lubricating and can, the inventor claims, be installed in two hours or less.

A convenient lighting system placed on the instrument board shows the gears the driver is in at all times. In other words, the gears are shifted automatically and the lighting system tells the driver in what gear he is.

FLYING A GASOLINE

A lot of club members have nicely restored gas pumps featuring popular brands such as Texaco, Standard Oil, Conoco, Sinclair and others.

We never saw the need to report on gas pumps until we saw the Flying A Gasoline pump recently restored by **John Stone.** Flying **A** should be appropriate for a Model A enthusiast because of the "**A**" we thought.

John never did have much interest in gas pumps until he discovered a National pump in the many "treasures" of his friend **Jerry Abplanalp**. This was a much different style than the Tokheim and Bennett pumps of the day.

It had curved glass towards the top of each side and did not normally come with a globe. This was a model A38 made in 1938 and production continued thru 1949.

John did some research and found that he could buy parts for the pump and Flying A Decals were available so he negotiated a trade with **Jerry** for some measuring equipment he had. **John** may have needed a diversion project from constant Model A engine work he does.

John stripped off the many coats of paint that was on the pump and found evidence that it had been used at a Vickers station and was also used for Fina, diesel #2. In the process of ordering parts he discovered that the vendor was supplying a Model A interior window crank for the crank handle that clears the pump reading. They were charging over \$20 for that item while the Model A part is under \$10. Fortunately he discovered this disparity before he ordered the expensive part.

The Flying A Gasoline trademark was created in 1932 after Getty Oil purchased the Tidewater



Petroleum Refining Company. The Flying A Brand was around until about 1970 when it was last used on the East Coast. If we correctly understand the long history of Flying A, Texaco now owns the remnants of the original company which was merged into their overall operation RG

When refueling, always put the gas cap in your pocket. This prevents the loss of expensive gas caps and possible paint damage from a falling cap.

HOFFMANS TRUSTY 29 PICKUP

Ray Hoffmans is one of a very few who still owns his first Model A, a 28 Roadster that his dad found in 1953. At 15 years of age, **Ray** had a restricted license and drove the roadster home from Manhattan. But, that's a story for another time.

The focus of this story will be **Ray's** 29 Model A Closed Cab pickup that he assembled in the early 80's. **Ray** had restored the Roadster while living in Denver in the 70's. After moving back to Wichita he joined the Sunflower A's and was active in the swap meet and other activities. Several guys were building what they called "junker pickups". They would find a pickup cab, then find all of the other parts, mostly not good parts but still serviceable. If any paint was applied it was a brush job. The object was to have an old truck for local tours but was never intended to look pretty or be used on long tours. And the cost was low.

Ray and Bo McHenry owned a couple of AA trucks in partnership. They really didn't have much enthusiasm for restoring them so Ray bought out Bo and decided to start a "junker pickup". Right off, he picked the best cab, hood, and radiator shell and bumper off the trucks. One truck had a double front bumper. It looked as if it was a production item, maybe built for some special truck use. Over the years people have referred to it as a cow catcher bumper, for obvious reasons.

Then **Ray** searched swap meets and other member's stock, to acquire a car frame, transmission and differential. He actually used a truck front end but had to convert the brake components to the smaller pickup/car size. The differential that he found had a 4:11 ring and pinion which he thought was too low geared so he bought a new 3:54 set which is considered high speed. This is one of a very few items on the pickup that was actually new. He picked the best, of the 2 engines he had, and did a \$90 overhaul on it which amounted to little more than a valve job.

Finally **Ray** had found everything except a pickup bed. At the swap meet in Wichita he talked to a vendor from Cimarron who said he had a bed. He said it was resting in a pasture but was pretty good. **Ray** made a deal with him and told him to bring it to the meet next year. Do you get the idea that **Ray** wasn't in a hurry? The vendor delivered it the next year and naturally it wasn't as good as described. Actually not near as good. The rear of the bed had been buried in the dirt. But **Ray** took it anyway. The rear "U" beam was beyond repair so a new one had to be installed and riveted in. No easy chore.

Ray decided to put a decent paint job on the pickup for fear that his wife Rita wouldn't want to ride in it. He sprayed it with two stage acrylic enamel. It came out good and still looks good today.

Sept. '85 and the pickup was finished. The first long trip, was an out of state trip. **Hoffmans** took the pickup on a club sponsored Labor Day Weekend tour to an annual celebration in Independence, Mo.

Actually **Rita** liked the roll up windows after putting up with the wind and side curtains of their roadster all of those years.



Bootlegger? Not Really!

But, this was just the beginning. In 1986 they went to The World Meet in Geneva, Wisconsin. Then as years came and went the **Hoffmans** drove the pickup to St Louis and then not necessarily in this order, came Louisville, Kentucky, Vicksburg, Mississippi, Holly Beach, Louisiana, Galveston, Texas, Carlsbad & Roswell, New Mexico, all over Southern Colorado including Durango & Pikes Peak, South Dakota, Black Hills, Wyoming and Montana. Then back to Green Bay Wisconsin. In 2010 they took a 5,000 mile trip to the World Meet in Vancouver and added two Canadian provinces, Alberta and British Columbia, plus the states of Idaho and Washington. Total US states visited is now 18.

And the \$90 overhaul lasted almost 20 years. Preparatory to one trip, several years back **Ray** detected a knock in the lower engine area. He and **John Stone** took off the pan and replaced the #2 connecting rod without pulling the head. Then in '08 **Ray** pulled the engine and **John** did a complete overhaul on it. Still the same engine from 1985, but this time he added a high compression head. And the amazing part, after 72,000 miles, the pickup never ever quit them on the road. It did sputter a time or two in a heavy rain storm but dried itself out and kept going. **Ray** still runs the stock distributor, generator and 6 volt sealed beams, from an old stock kit he found.

Ray did have a "rash" of flat tires, for awhile. Two flats within 15 minutes and another later in the evening, near Colorado Springs one year. He finally determined that the tires had stiff sidewalls that didn't flex on steep banked curves and would pinch the tube. He took all of the old tubes he had accumulated and made liners to insert between the tubes and rims and the problem was solved. That was about 10 years ago. He has since installed a new set of Firestone tires with those old liners and has almost worn this set out but has never had another flat.

After more than 72,000 miles "Trusty Ole' Blue" is still ready to roll. RG


