REMEMBERING ROBERT BRUCE



Robert, Bruce, 1932-2015

Bob and his Wife **JoAnn** joined the Model A Club in 1968 and have been active members ever since. **Bob** served as President in 1970. He was also Swap Meet Chairman in the nineties.

Bob was raised on a farm near Mt Vernon, Illinois and met **JoAnn** while going to school there. After graduating in 1951, the job market in Mt Vernon was practically nil but he was able to land a job at Boeing in Wichita. In 1952 **Bob** thought it was inevitable that he would be drafted with the War going on in Korea. He didn't want to go to the Army so he enlisted in the Air Force. The couple were married in 1952 while **Bob** was stationed at Biloxi, Mississippi. In 1956 **Bob** was discharged from the Air Force and was able to get his job back at Boeing, so this determined their location for the rest of their years. Over the years **Bob** took many classes and courses and worked his way up to an Illustrator Draftsman in the Engineering Dept. They joined the Pilgrim Congregational Church in 1958 and became very respected members. One lady at **Bob's** funeral described them as Pillars in the Church.

Their first Model A was a 29 coupe purchased in 1965. **Bob** added a rumble seat to accommodate their daughters **Debbie** and **Karen**. About 1980 or so Bob purchased a 31 S/W Fordor which he restored with the help of **Wes Ellis** another early club member with restoration skills. In the nineties He decided that an open car would be "cool" so he purchased a 29 Roadster from **Larry Menges**. In 2007 he had the opportunity to purchase a rare 31 4DR Phaeton from **Merv Criser** and sold the other two Model A's.

Over the years the **Bruces** attended many regional and national tours. Some of the locations included, Milwaukee, St Louis, Kansas City, Omaha, Vail, Breckenridge, and Dallas to mention a few. The longest tour was the World Meet in Vancouver, BC, in 2010. They drove the Model A to all events except the first one in 1970 when they took the coupe with a tow bar behind their station wagon.

Last December **Bob** was diagnosed with Leukemia and his Doctor thought it could be cured with several months of chemo. All signs were improving until August when he also contacted Shingles. He just couldn't conquer both diseases and passed away September 14th.

The **Bruces** were well respected in the club and community as evidence by the large crowd at the funeral. There were 21 Model A's driven at the request of **Jo-Ann**.

Bob was always good natured and willing to help anyone be it Model A repairs or other tasks. He will be fondly remembered well into the future.

Tech Talk

TAIL PIPE CLAMP TOO TIGHT??

We wrote an article about this subject several years ago, but with so many new members the last few years it probably needs to be repeated. The common misconception is that the tail pipe clamp should be really tight to keep it from rattling. NOT SO!!!

The tail pipe clamp where it secures the pipe to the frame should be just a little more than finger tight. As the exhaust manifold heats up and cools off, it needs to be able to physically move a slight amount. If the tail pipe clamp is tight this movement is not possible and over a period of time the stress on the cast iron manifold will cause it to distort and sometimes crack.

The correct fastener for this purpose is a fine thread bolt with castellated nut and cotter key. These are available from most Model A parts suppliers.

A good way to accomplish this setting is to support the muffler with a floor jack and then remove the exhaust pipe

clamp at the manifold. Then lower the jack very slightly and you can adjust the tail pipe clamp to the point where it is secure and the tail pipe will barely slide back and forth in the clamp. The castellated nut will allow you to make very slight adjustments and when the cotter key is installed it will stay in place, and usually there is no rattle.

We find no evidence that Ford Motor Company was aware of this problem during the Model A production years. They were aware of the distorted and manifold crack problem and in 1931 improved the manifold with a reinforcing web on the exhaust outlet.

Shortly after Model A production ceased they must have discovered that the exhaust pipe and muffler shouldn't be rigid to the manifold and added flexible mounts to support the pipe on the subsequent models. This was carried on in later years and was common to all makes of cars.



On a recent hot day we tried to measure the movement of the tailpipe by scribing a mark on each side of the tail pipe clamp and driving about 20 miles at highway speed. After returning we tried to measure the movement of the tailpipe and it was hardly enough to measure but was somewhere between a 1/16 and 1/32 inch, none the less important. It was surprising to us that the movement was forward rather that rearward. RG

THIS DAY IN HISTORY JANUARY 17, 1929

Popeye makes 1st appearance, in comic strip "Thimble Theater"

Popeye made his first public appearance on January 17, 1929, in Elzie Segar's then nine-year old comic strip, Thimble Theater, which originally revolved around Olive Oyl's family. From the minute he walked into the comic strip, Thimble Theater, and muttered his famous "D'ja think I'm a cowboy" line, Popeye the Sailor Man captured the hearts of millions of fans around the world. Popeye was just a sailor then without any heroic shade. Later the character of Popeye became so popular that the entire comic strip started to revolve around this sailor-man. Then, Thimble Theater changed into the comics of Popeye where Olive Oyl became Popeye's sweetheart. After Elzie Segar's death in 1938, a number of writers continued the comic strips of Popeye.

Popeye made the jump to the silver screen in 1933 in a Betty Boop cartoon entitled "Popeye The Sailor" from the Fleischer Studios. Popeye's theme song, titled "I'm Popeye The Sailor Man", composed by Sammy Lemer in 1933 for Fleischer's first Popeye the Sailor cartoon, has become forever associated with the sailor. In 1937, spinach capital Crystal City, Texas, erected a statue to honor Elzie Segar and Popeye for their positive influence on America's eating habits, making Popeye the first cartoon character ever immortalized in public sculpture. Interestingly, Popeye's spinach obsession began in Thimble Theater but became an indispensable plot device in his later animated adventures. The spinach growers credited Popeye with a 33 percent increase in U.S. spinach consumption and saving the spinach industry in the 1930's.

The controversy of Spinach remained for decades. The most popular concept is it was actually the forbidden wide 'marijuana'. However recent research also reveals that Spinach may be an herb with somewhat muscle boosting qualities, obviously not like the incredible strength of Popeye. However, whatever be the spinach is, the concept of eating spinach and then beating the villains away has managed to retain its popularity for over 80 years. Many consider Popeye a precursor to the superheroes who would eventually come to dominate comic books.


