Big Kansas Road Trip

Road Trip to Halstead



One of my favorite movie lines was from Dorothy Gale. You're probably saying to yourself, "who in the heck is Dorothy Gale?" (oh how quickly we forget!) The Wizard of Oz Dorothy and her little dog Toto! Now that you recall Dorothy, do you recall the line from the Wizard of Oz: "If I ever go looking for my heart's desire again, I won't look any further than my own backyard. Because if it isn't there...then I never really lost it to begin with?"

Saturday, September 6, 2025, 35 Wichita A members and 2 guests found their heart's desire by traveling a short 22 miles north to Halstead, Kansas. In our own backyard is a fascinating small town (2,179 folks). Named after Murat Halstead, a prominent Civil War Correspondent and newspaper editor, the history of Halstead is preserved at the Halstead Heritage Museum and Depot. The museum is housed in an old, Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Train Depot built in 1917 and is a vast reservoir of times past.



Sensory Overload. Arriving at the Halstead Heritage Museum & Depot our group of Model A's provided a smorgasbord picture of history. Twenty-one Model A Fords parked in front of a 1917 railroad depot with a 2025 manufactured Boeing 737 fuselage built in Wichita on a railcar headed to Renton/Everett, Washington for final assembly. The train just happened by as our Model A's parked. A picture of how fast things change!




Our little group of Model A's (21 cars) and two modern, provided a long string of nostalgic memories for the people of Halstead and Big Kansas Road Trip (BKRT) attendees. The twenty-two mile proximity of Halstead to Wichita made it possible for many of our club members to attend their first ever **Big Kansas Road Trip**.

Inside the Halstead Heritage Museum our group was given a tour by Kimberly Hon. (Holding microphone. Kimberly was named after Kim Novak who appeared in the film "Picnic" filmed in part, in Halstead in 1955). The museum is filled with a large variety of items related to Halstead and the early years of train travel. Of particular interest was the historical background narrative that Kimberly provided on the "Harvey Girls". Fred Harvey (created the 1st restaurant chain in the US) initially hired men as waiters in his restaurants along the Santa Fe railroad line. Mr. Harvey replaced the men with women known as the "Harvey Girls" because the men were often drunk, unreliable and took little pride in their work. A Harvey Girls dress was on display which was reversable so that the wait staff always appeared with clean uniform clothing - (2 dresses for the price of one and quick change for an always professional, clean appearance!) The Harvey Girls elevated standards of service and actually brought civility to travelers along the Santa Fe railroad line.





In 1902 Dr. Arthur E. Hertzler founded the former Halstead Hospital. Through Dr. Hertzler's efforts the hospital quickly grew and became known as the "Little Mayo Clinic of the Great Plains". Although the hospital is now closed, Halstead continues to build on its legacy for providing health care through the **Halstead Kansas Learning Center for Health.** Founded in 1965, the center offers hands-on, interactive health and science programs and "Valeda"! Valeda is a voluptuous "seethrough" woman. An anatomical mannequin that demonstrates human anatomy by lighting up while providing a narrative of our internal organs and body systems.

During our lifetime, we spend approximately one-third of it at our jobs. It has always been fascinating to me to learn how others make their livelihood. Our BKRT to Halstead opened our eyes with "A Day in the Life of Bobbi's Cutters" (www.bobbiscutters.com). Our Model A group toured the manufacturing facility for cookie cutters! In true Kansas fashion, Bobbi's Cutters is located on a farmstead just outside of Halstead. What they do is magical. The woman owned company (Bobbi) manufacturers cookie cutters using 3D printers. Starting out by designing a grasshopper as a novelty item for a friend has grown into a business providing hundreds of cookie cutter designs. Our group also learned about CookieCon, the world's largest convention showcasing cookie art, cookie supplies etc., all focused on the art and business of making cookies & cookie decorating. Who knew? When Bobbi learned that the Wichita A's would be touring her facility she offered up front parking for the occasion and advised that she probably should make a Model A cookie cutter for our group.

I will end this retelling of our BKRT trip to Halstead with our tour of Bobbi's Cutters. However, as I discovered during my trip planning, there is a lot more to Halstead than our group had time for. Riverside Park, Swinging Bridge, Huge Flood Gates, Arkansas Valley Interurban Railroad and more. All in Halstead. As Dorothy Gail so aptly noted, one can find their heart's desire in their own backyard. And unlike Dorothy, we do not need a pair of ruby red slippers to go home to Kansas. Living in Kansas we can just use our Model A's to discover what's in our own backyard. Ahooga

A big Thank You to Mike and Kathy James for being our great Tour Leaders! Also, a big Thank You to Mike who wrote this article in record time! We are leaving in a few days for Michigan and Gilmore Museum so had to expedite the newsletter!

TECH ARTICLE

Quick Release Tudor Seats

Idea suggested by Ray Gross, Colorado Spring, Colorado Illustration by John Pratt, Urbana, Illinois TTILY TIPS

Editor's note: My friend Ray Gross from the Pikes Peak Model A Ford Club secures the front seats of his 1931 Tudor Sedan with hardware store pins that came with a hole that fits a heavy duty cotter pin or quick release pin. Instead of having to use a wrench whenever he needs the seats out of the way, he just needs to pull the pin.

Technical director Paul Shinn says, "I did that on my Tudor using hardware made for that purpose from the boating supply store West Marine. Their 'hitch pins' use a hardened stainless that is much safer and stronger than a drilled bolt."

Illustrator's note: I also found that a new brake clevis pin fits almost perfectly. There are two basic sizes of these pins, and one would need to have the hole drilled out only slightly. The illustration shows one of these pins, plus the one that Paul Shinn suggested."



Shoe Adornments

Leather bows, steel beads, rhinestones, and marcasites are just a few of the materials used in making shoe clips. The clips resembled costume jewelry of the era. The ornaments were sold to dress up a shoe or add interest to the plain pump, and expand the shoe wardrobe. They were usually clipped onto the portion above the toecap but another look was created by clipping them on the side, as shown in the illustration. In addition to the clips for the front of the shoe, decorative straps were made which were clipped onto the shoe across the instep, thus securing the shoe and dressing it up for the evening.
